Future tense – Study guide page 6

Time words: tomorrow, next week, this afternoon, next year, etc.

We use the future tense to talk about things that are going to happen. We use the word “**will**” to indicate the future tense.

If the subject is “I” or “we”, and the sentence is not a question, then “shall” has been correct, and “will” has expressed a level of termination, or a promise. If the subject is NOT “I” or “we”, then the future tense has “will”
